

Policy for Cross-Listing Courses with Other Units UF Linguistics Department

This policy specifies the procedures and requirements for cross-listing classes in Linguistics that will be taught by instructors not affiliated with Linguistics.

Requests to cross-list a course with Linguistics should be directed by the Chair, Director, or a Coordinator in the instructor's unit to the Linguistics Department Chair. All such requests must be received by the Linguistics Chair no later than six months prior to the proposed course offering. All requests must be accompanied by a prospective syllabus that conforms to all requirements of the UF syllabus policy.

Requests for cross-listing will be reviewed by the members of the Linguistics Department Curriculum Committee. In reviewing requests, the committee will consider whether the course content of the proposed course is sufficiently within the bounds of the field of Linguistics to make it appropriate for cross-listing, whether the course as a whole is sufficiently well-conceived, whether its assignments and assessments are appropriately rigorous, and whether the course complements the department's existing course offerings. The committee will also consider whether the instructor has the appropriate professional qualifications, expertise, and experience to teach a course in Linguistics at the same level as the department's permanent faculty.

Previously approved crosslisted courses for Linguistics do not need to be approved again, unless there is a change of instructor or a significant change in content.

Should the committee members recommend approval of the cross-listing request, they will also make a recommendation regarding the course number it could appropriately be given for the purposes of cross-listing.
